☐ Teams competed in the musical chairs scavenger hunt, M&M relay, sack lunch relay, egg toss, not-so-newlywed game and reverse wheelchair race.
☐ Every year, team activities take a break for the Relay For Life Luminaria Ceremony. The track was lit up with candles to remember those affected by cancer, and their names were read as participants recognized why they were there—for hope, to celebrate, to remember and to fight back. Dozens of luminaria were dedicated in memory of those lost to cancer and in honor of those still fighting the disease.
