As Phillips County readies itself for the upcoming fair, Fair Queen Sarah Heermann reflects on her time spent as fair royalty.

Heermann was officially crowned queen at the 2009 Haxtun Corn Festival, but preparations for the role started long beforehand. "I have always wanted to be the Fair Queen because I wanted to represent Phillips County," Heermann said.

Having lived in Holyoke her whole life, Heermann has been attending the Fair for as long as she can remember. She has been in the Challengers 4-H Club for eight years. She is also a four-year member of the Logan County Horse Judging Team.

Discussing her reasons for running for Fair Queen, Heermann shared that she thinks the Fair Queen plays a vital role in keeping a vibrant county fair atmosphere. Showing horses at the Phillips County Fair, Heermann has claimed three years of Senior High Point All Around Champion. She has also been the Senior High Point Champion at the Phillips County Amateur Rodeo, receiving the Bank of Colorado's college scholarship for three years.

Heermann is a Level II Western Division rider in Nebraska and Colorado. She has competed in both Nebraska and Colorado State Fairs. She is the 2009 Colorado State Fair, Western Division State Champion.
