### **Twenty-Five Years Ago** **Jan. 21, 1988**

Numerous cancellations were seen in the Holyoke area Monday and Tuesday due to the blizzard that hit town around 8 a.m. Monday. Holyoke weatherman Dale Anderson reported that the Monday snow report taken at 7 a.m. Tuesday indicated about .8 of an inch of moisture and about 10 inches of snow.
