Around 220 people gathered Sunday morning, March 24 for worship, fellowship and the dedication of the new First Baptist Church facility located on the southeast edge of town at 1000 E. Johnson St.

The special service was a time to reconnect with current and former members, friends, community members and those who helped with the building process.

Guest speakers Dr. Paul Borden, director of the Rocky Mountain Church Network, and Pastor Gary Jones, who served the church from 1990-2006, both emphasized that the new facility is merely a tool to be used for God's glory and to reach out to the community.

In its 125-year history, this is the third building for Holyoke First Baptist Church. The first two, both located at 343 S. Baxter Ave., were built in 1893 and 1928.

The church broke ground on the new \$1.6 million facility in July 2011, with the first services held the weekend of Jan. 19-20 earlier this year. The 14,000 square feet offers a large auditorium that seats 240, a big fellowship hall, multi-purpose/youth room, nursery, offices, kitchen and several classrooms.
