Floats in the parade will be decorated to represent specific decades. Car registrants have the opportunity to enter into the parade behind the era floats.

Casey Blake, who has been helping with organizing Dandelion Daze, said that having the car show and the anniversary celebration at the same time is beneficial to both parties.

Blake mentioned that many entrants in the car show are from out of town, and the city's attractions through the weekend is something they are sure to enjoy.

Awards for Dandelion Daze include Top 15, Top Gun (Rodder's Choice) and People's Choice.

Brian Akey is the chairperson for Dandelion Daze this year.

There will also be a beard contest and vintage clothing contest. The overall beard winner and the male and female winners for the clothing contest will serve as parade grand marshals.
