The week also featured a talent show and ice cream social.

Guest speakers at the 2009 Girls State included Colorado Speaker of the House Terrance Carroll and Jeffrey Pine, a singer/songwriter.

"Every morning we would all meet to raise the flag, and then every night we would retire it," said Roth. She added, "During one of the special assemblies, we learned about flag etiquette and were each given a standard size flag of our own."
