The seventh annual Colorado Ag Classic will be held Wednesday-Thursday, Dec. 7-8 at the Embassy Suites in Loveland.

The Colorado Ag Classic is the joint convention of the Colorado Association of Wheat Growers (CAWG), the Colorado Corn Growers Association (CCGA), Colorado Sunflower Administrative Committee (CSAC), Colorado Sorghum Producers (CSP), Colorado Seed Growers Association (CSGA) and Colorado Seed Industry Association (CSIA).

The convention will begin on the evening of Dec. 7, with a legislative social, dinner and an auction to benefit CAWG and CCGA's state and national legislative efforts.



A trade show will also take place during the Colorado Ag Classic. Representatives from agricultural businesses from around the state will be present to answer questions on their products.
