

Corn and beet harvest progressing

Following the area's first snow, local farmers are back in the fields and diligently working to harvest corn and sugar beet crops.

Steve Bahnsen of Paoli Farmers Co-op said Tuesday morning that corn harvest was around 75 percent complete. Steve Young of Grainland Co-op reiterated and said things were 75-80 percent complete on the east side of the county.

Both cooperatives reported a better than expected crop when it comes to the irrigated corn crop. Farmers were reporting around 200 bushels an acre or better with test weights coming in around 59-60 pounds.

Young said as long as farmers could keep water on the corn, the extreme heat didn't affect it much—in fact, corn likes warmer temperatures. As long as water could be kept running, things turned out well. "Excellent," Bahnsen said of the irrigated corn they were receiving.

Sugar beet harvest picked back up in recent weeks as trucks began rolling through town. The pile north of Holyoke has been growing by the day and trucks can be seen hauling the crop west to the Western Sugar location in Fort Morgan.
