The team created a report outlining the activity of the chapter over the past year. The report was updated after the state competition and then sent to National FBLA to be evaluated.

Holyoke was also represented in two other events. Anastasia Conklin, Tia Huffman and Brittney Prottzman submitted a nomination for Holyoke branch manager of the Bank of Colorado Gary Krumm for the Business Person of the Year competition, earning them first place at state. Conklin and Prottzman represented the team at nationals where they were joined by Krumm.

Flying out to the conference to join Holyoke, Krumm was recognized during the Colorado state meeting as the Business Person of the Year.

Krumm serves on the chapter's business advisory committee and has been dedicated to keeping the school's business department up to date. He has played an integral role in the FBLA chapter events by critiquing, grading, speaking, fundraising and supporting.
