"We have a good freshman class and our sophomore class has stayed strong," the coach said.



"We're excited about the year and we're excited that we'll be able to stay competitive and hopefully win some games we weren't supposed to," the coach said.


The Dragons finished the 2009 campaign with a 1-8 record. The lone win was a 40-21 triumph over Peyton in front of the homecoming crowd.
