The Dragons added two runs in the third and eight more in the fourth to close out the game early by run rule.

Four of the runs in the fourth inning came off the bat of Trevor Dalton who belted his first homer of the season with the bases chalk full of Dragons. The bomb increased the Dragons' lead to 17-0.
