

Edmonds wins first nat'l championship

HHS senior Mark Edmonds won his first national wrestling tournament championship when he was named champion in the April 7 Midwest Classic Nationals in Kearney, Neb.

Held at the Buffalo County Fairgrounds in Kearney, the Midwest Classic featured 16 mats and over 700 high school wrestlers.

Edmonds drew a first-round bye in his 132-lb. competition, then won four straight to take the championship.

He pinned Jesse Lammers of Cedar Valley in 2:19, won a 5-1 decision over Seth Nehls of Kearney High, pinned Skyler Teten of Syracuse in :46 and won a 5-3 decision over Isaac Elge of Nebraska Christian in the championship.

Edmonds was coached by Allen Strong of Holyoke.

The three-time state champion in Colorado wrestling entered the Midwest Classic Nationals with determination. He had placed third the last three years and was determined to win this year.

It was a great way to finish in his last high school wrestling tournament.

Senior Nationals in Virginia Beach, Va. March 28-April 1 proved quite disappointing for the Dragon standout.

In his first-round match, Edmonds drew Cole Mendenhall, a four-time state champion in Montana, who is ranked 9th in the U.S. Mendenhall defeated Edmonds and went on to place second in the senior nationals tourney.
