Holyoke Dragon baseball team bounced back after its first two losses of the season to sweep Yuma 5-1 and 9-2 in Holyoke Monday, April 9.

Holyoke's strong pitching staff deserves credit for keeping the Indians at bay throughout the day.

"It was great how the boys responded after two tough loses to Burlington," coach Kyle Bules said. "The pitchers did an exceptional job of keeping Yuma hitters off balance and pounding the strike zone."

Baumgartner, who started on the mound, sat the Indians down in order in the fourth inning with three consecutive looking strikeouts. He was part of a three up, three down fifth inning with two more strikeouts. He would go on to strike out 12 batters during his complete seven innings of work.

Holyoke catcher Hermosillo caught a Yuma base runner napping at third base and picked him off to end the Indians' sixth inning.

### Holyoke 9, Yuma 2
