Led by six returning seniors, the HHS 2012-13 wrestling team is 25 members strong for the largest team in quite some time.


The Dragon wrestling squad is four members larger than last year and close to triple the size of the nine-member 2010-11 team.


There are some team members with little to no experience, and Garrison looks forward to working with them, as well. "Hopefully we will improve as a team," he added.
