Akron came out in a zone defense against the Dragons to start the game. HHS has had some difficulty attacking the basket against zones this season, but seemed to handle it better Friday.

From the get go, the two teams were engulfed in a physical matchup, with both teams being called for a number of fouls.

Turnovers and bad passes in the first quarter hurt the Dragons, but they ended the period down only 12-17.

The Dragons did a better job of getting to the paint and drawing fouls in the second quarter. Nearly a third of the Holyoke points came from the charity stripe as the boys knocked down nine of their 17 attempts in the first half.

On the heels of a 13-3 run to end the quarter, HHS entered the locker rooms up 30-29 at half.

Despite entering the intermission with the momentum in their favor, the Dragons came out flat in the second half.

Akron rattled off a 17-4 run to begin the half, and finished the third quarter up 50-39 on the Dragons.

Holyoke made a run in the fourth quarter, but was unable to stop the bleeding as Akron converted on free throws. The final score had the Dragons losing, 55-68.

Logan Tharp had an impressive night, scoring 25 points to lead the Dragons. Deyten Klein chipped in with 13 points, including three three-pointers.

Caliche gained ground in the second quarter however, securing a two-point lead by half.

The constant pressure and speed of the visiting squad took the Dragons out of their game. Dille noted that in trying to keep up with Caliche, HHS became less disciplined.
