The first quarter saw the two teams going shot for shot with one another. Both squads were accurate from deep as each hit two threes in the first eight minutes. At the end of the period, Holyoke was down 10-11.

HHS had an offensive explosion in the second quarter, rattling off 27 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. The Dragons hit seven shots from beyond the arc in the half, on their way to a season-high nine in the game.

The Dragons played a clean half of basketball. Dille praised the team for moving the ball and not settling for the outside shot.

In the second half the Dragons' tight defense frustrated the Eagles. The full-court press caused many turnovers as the Dragons picked up 11 steals along the way. Freshman Bradley Cumming, who got the start for the first time this season, led the team with four steals.

Again the offense put up big numbers in the fourth quarter. The Dragons poured in 22 points in the final period to secure a 74-47 win.
