After shutting down the Cougars in the top of the first inning, three Dragons crossed home in the bottom half of the inning.

Trevor Dalton got things started with a one-out double down the left-field line. Jaydin Goldenstein singled up the middle to bring Dalton home for the first score of the game.

Three batters later, Logan Tharp doubled to the left-center alley, bringing in two more runs, giving the Dragons an early 3-0 lead.


Burlington responded in the second with four runs of their own on four hits and two Dragon

Burlington's 4-3 lead wouldn't last long as the Dragons added two runs in the bottom of the second inning to gain the 5-4 advantage. The inning was highlighted with a Goldenstein solo home run to left field that sparked the two-out, two-run inning for HHS.

Holyoke showed their power again the next inning as Deyten Klein sent a Burlington pitch over the left-center fence for a three-run shot. The Dragons picked up six runs in the inning to further their lead to 11-4.


# Holyoke 10, Burlington 0

None of the players who start on the team have a batting average below .350. Dalton leads the team with a .576 average.




