Additionally, Nick Flaa was approved as assistant HS boys' basketball coach for 2013-14.

Athletic director Sandra Rahe reported on the fall sports programs.

She also noted there will be changes to the football conference, with Burlington coming in and Cornerstone Christian and Resurrection Christian leaving. Proposals have been made for changes to volleyball regional seeding, as well.

Additionally, she noted Burlington was denied into the LPAA as Caliche will be 2A and in this district during the next cycle.

Rahe said LPAA is working on a proposal to apply a multiplier to all schools who can select their enrollment. As an example, each student would be counted as 1.35 or 1.5. So the school could potentially move into a larger classification as a result.
